Rules

- 1.1 The regatta will be governed by the rules as defined in the Racing Rules of Sailing (RRS) and with appendix S and the SRS rules (Swedish Rating System). The sailing instructions will consist of the instructions in RRS Appendix S, Standard Sailing Instructions, and supplementary sailing instructions that will be on the official notice board outside the race office and published at www.ksss.se
- 1.2 Boats may in accordance with World Sailing regulation 20 display advertising chosen and supplied by the organizing authority.
- 1.3 Each participating boat must be equipped with VHF, a bucket with handle, a compass, an anchor, a lifebuoy, a 15-25 meter long throw line (at least 6 mm diameter), a sharp knife easily accessible in cockpit and from deck, each crew member should have a life jacket with whistle. If the boat has fuel / gas, an easily accessible fire extinguisher must be available.
- 1.4 The penalty for breaking rule 55 will be at the discretion of the protest committee (DPI).

2 Eligibility requirements

- 2.1 The person in charge must be a member of a club affiliated to the National Sailing Federation.
- 2.2 Each participating boat shall be insured with valid third party liability insurance.
- 2.3 Competitors participate in the regatta entirely at their own risk. See RRS 4, Decision to Race. The organizing authority will not accept any liability for material damage or personal injury or death sustained in conjunction with or prior to, during, or after the regatta.

- 2.4 Classic Yachts are defined as boats launched before January 1st 1968, and remained mainly conformal to her original plans. She has a hull made of wood or steel. Alternatively, a replica built anytime, which is built in conformity with or is a copy of an existing boat, or according to an original one off design before January 1st 1968. The Race Committee decides if a boat is allowed to enter as a Classic Yacht.
- 2.5 Yachts less than 7 meters length are not allowed unless approved by the Race Committee.
- 2.6 Crew shall consist of a minimum of two persons.
- 2.7 By participating in this event competitors grant to the organizing authority and their sponsors, the right in perpetuity to make, use and show, from time to time at their discretion, any photos or any motion pictures and live, taped or filmed television and other reproductions of the athlete and yacht during the period of the competition without compensation.
- 2.8 The person in charge shall follow the rules for racing license as decided by the Swedish Sailing Federation. Competitors from other countries than Sweden are exempt from this requirement.

3 Entries

- 3.1 Entry shall be made not later than July 22nd 2019 at KSSS website www.ksss.se
- 3.2 Entry Fee

Classic up to 40 ft: 2.400 SEK late entry 2.600 SEK Classic more than 40 ft: 2.900 SEK late entry 3.100 SEK

- 3.3 The fee is paid online when entering. Entry after July 22nd is to the higher fee.
- 3.4 Confirmation of entry after online payment of entry fee according to

4 Registration

- 4.1 Registration shall be made at the Race Office at the latest Thursday August 8th, 09:55 hours.
- 4.2 Controls of participating boats compliance with certificate, class rules and regulations according to Notice of Race and Sailing Instructions may be done at any time during the regatta.

5 Sailing Instructions

Sailing instructions will be published online on www.ksss.se in the end of July. Starting list and starting order will be distributed at the skippers meeting.

7 Racing area

7.1 The racing will take place close to Sandhamn. Parts of the racing may take place at open sea (weather minimal will not apply).

8 Courses

- 8.1 The courses will be distance courses app 1-4 hours and will be presented at the daily Skippers meeting. Consideration will be taken for course variety.
- 8.2 While racing, yachts shall not enter areas that local government or other regulations say are forbidden to enter, forbidden to pass or otherwise. These areas are obstructions as defined in the RRS.

9 Protests and penalty systems

- 9.1 The races will be sailed according to Appendix T1.
- 9.2 KSR Appendix T1 will apply. A penalty after racing will be with 3% increase in sailed time. This changes App T1 b.

10 Scoring

10.1 Low Point System according to RRS Appendix A.

11 Prizes

11.1 Perpetual prizes. KSSS prizes in according to the number of entered boats in the class, one prize of each started five boats, not more than eight prizes in each class.

Mooring

Participating boats do not pay harbour fee in the KSSS harbours at Sandhamn/Lö-kholmen during the period of 7th - 11th of August. Harbour fee for days connecting to the regatta is 50 % of regular price.

KSSS Sustainability

The Baltic Sea is sensitive to pollution. All sailors, officials and visitors are responsible for the health of our waters. We are committed to limiting the negative environmental impact of the regatta and we expect everyone involved to follow these guidelines bellow!

- Bring your own personal reusable water bottle. No disposable plastic bottles are allowed. If you use sports drinks, bring along a powdered sports drink mix to use in your reusable water bottle.
- No plastic bags or disposable plastics are allowed on the water. Bring only reusable items such as fabric bags and food containers.
- Please refrain from using detergents that can adversely affect water quality.
- Prevent marine waste. Keep the trash safe on board so it does not blow in the water. All waste should be disposed of in containers ashore.
- Fill fuel tanks slowly and use absorbent pads to trap drops and spills. Do not overfill the fuel tank. Try to leave the tank 10% empty so that the fuel can expand when the fuel is heated. Make sure your engine is well maintained to avoid oil or fuel leakage.
- Reduce fuel consumption by turning off your engine when it is safe to do so, anchoring instead of idle, and slowing down the speed.
