

# **Supplementary Sailing Instructions (SI)**

# KSSS Olympic Class Regatta Course Area D

Dates: 5-6 October 2024

Location: Saltsjöbaden

Class: Formula Foil – Open, Formula Foil – Open U19, Waszp - Open

Organizing authority: Royal Swedish Yacht Club (KSSS)

# 1. Location of the race office and of the flagpole

- The regatta office is located at KSSS Clubhouse in Saltsjöbaden. The Official Noticeboard is online at the KSSS web page KSSS Olympic Class Regatta KSSS
- 1.2 Signals made ashore will be displayed at flagpole next to the water close to Sjövillan.
- 1.3 When flag AP is displayed ashore, '1 minute' is replaced with 'not less than 20 minutes' in RRS Race Signals.
- 1.4 On the water, the race committee communicates with coaches, supporting persons etc. on VHF channel 71.

#### 2. Time schedule

2.1 Time for the first warning signal

Saturday 5 October 10:55 Sunday 6 October 09:55

- 2.2 On the last day of racing no warning signal will be made after 15:00.
- 2.3 16 races are planned for all classes. The number of races to be sailed each day will be decided at the discretion of the Race Committee based on forecasted weather conditions.

#### 3. Marks

3.1 The rounding marks are inflatable white tetrahedron.

The starting mark is a spar buoy with an orange flag.

The finishing mark is a spar buoy with a blue flag.

3.2 To change the next leg of the course, the race committee will move the original mark (or move the finishing line) without signaling. This changes RRS 33 and AppS 10.1.

#### 4. Time limits

#### 4.1 Windward-leeward course

The race committee will try to set the course so that a race will take approximately 15 minutes to sail.

Time limit for the first boat to sail the course and finish is 25 minutes.

A boat that does not finish within 10 minutes after the first boat has finished, will be scored Did Not Finish (DNF). This changes RRS 35.

## 4.2 Slalom course (starboard or port)

The race committee will try to set the course so that a race will take approximately 4 minutes to sail.

Time limit for the first five boats to sail a race is 8 minutes.

Time limit for the first five boats to pass mark 1 is 1 minute (60 seconds) from the starting signal.


## 5. Changes and addition to RRS appendix S

5.1 Formula Foil and Wasp can alternate between windward-leeward course and slalom course

#### 5.2 Windward-leeward course


The diagram below shows the course, the order in which marks are to be passed and the side of which each mark is to be left. The course is to be sailed:



(2 laps): Start - 1 - (2a/2b) - 1 - (2a2b) - Pinend - Finish
(3 laps): Start - 1 - (2a/2b) - 1 - (2a/2b) - 1 - (2a/,2b) - Pinend - Finish
```



- 5.3 The finishing line is between a staff displaying an orange flag on the race committee vessel and a blue flag on the course side of the finishing mark.
- 5.4 Slalom course (starboard or port)

The diagram below shows the course, the order in which marks are to be passed and the side of which each mark is to be left. The course is to be sailed (1 laps): Start - 1 - 2 - 3 - Finish





5.5 The class flags, and course flags are:

- Waszp
- Formula Foil
- Corse Windward - Leeward
- Course Slalom
- 3 lap course

# 5.6 RRS 26 is changed as follows:

Minutes before the start	Visual signal	Sound signal	Means
5		One	Attention
	Class flag, course flag/-s, U, Black		
3	Flags with numbers  3 2 1	One	Warning signal
2	Flags with numbers  2 1	One	Preparatory signal
1	Flag with number	One long	One minute
0	Flag with number 1 and other flags, except O/R, are removed	One	Starting signal

- 5.7 A boat that does not start within four minutes after her starting signal will be scored Did Not Start (DNS) without a hearing. This changes RRS A5.1 and A5.2.
- 5.8 The protest time limit is 30 minutes after the last boat finishes the last race of the day or the race committee signals no more racing today, whichever is later. This change AppS 13.2.
